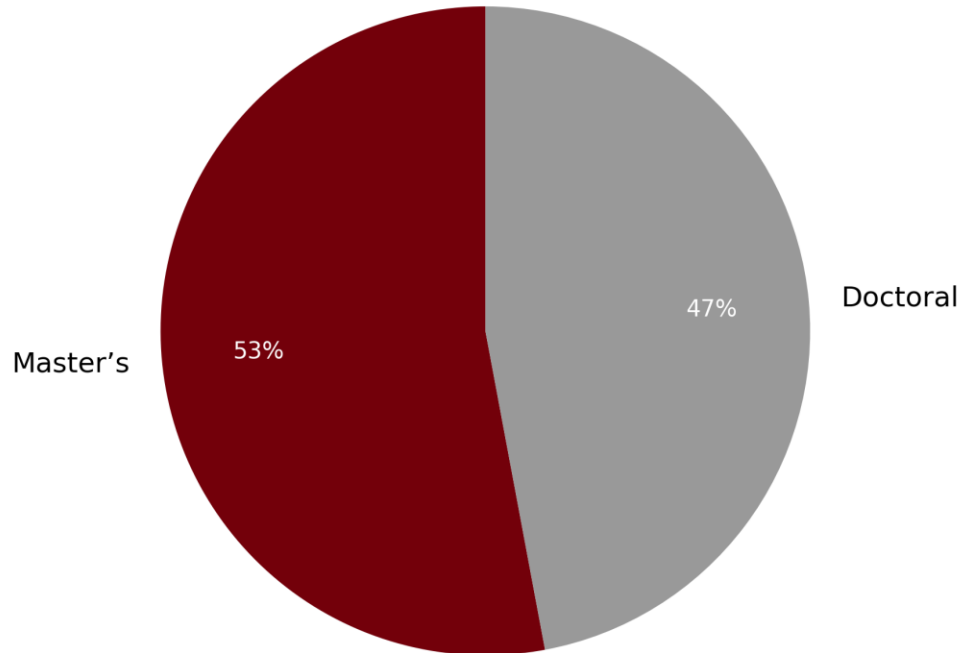

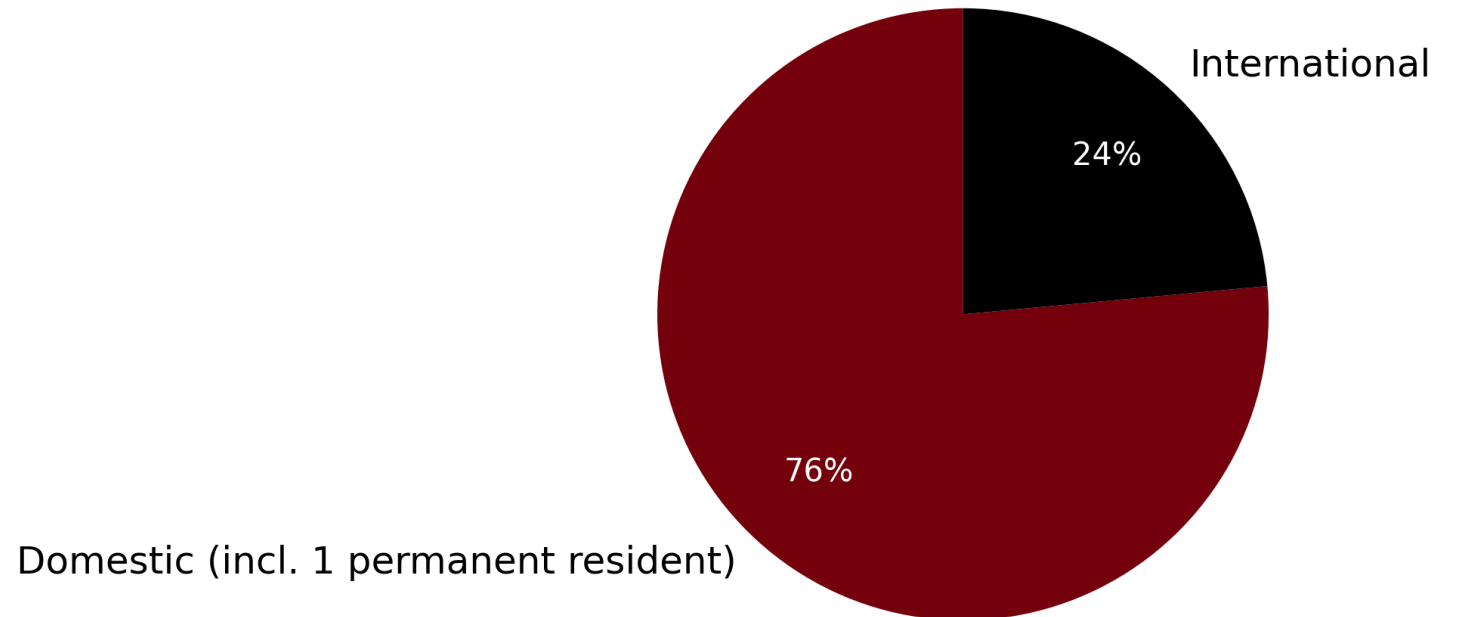
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ENROLLMENT BREAKDOWN

Degree Type

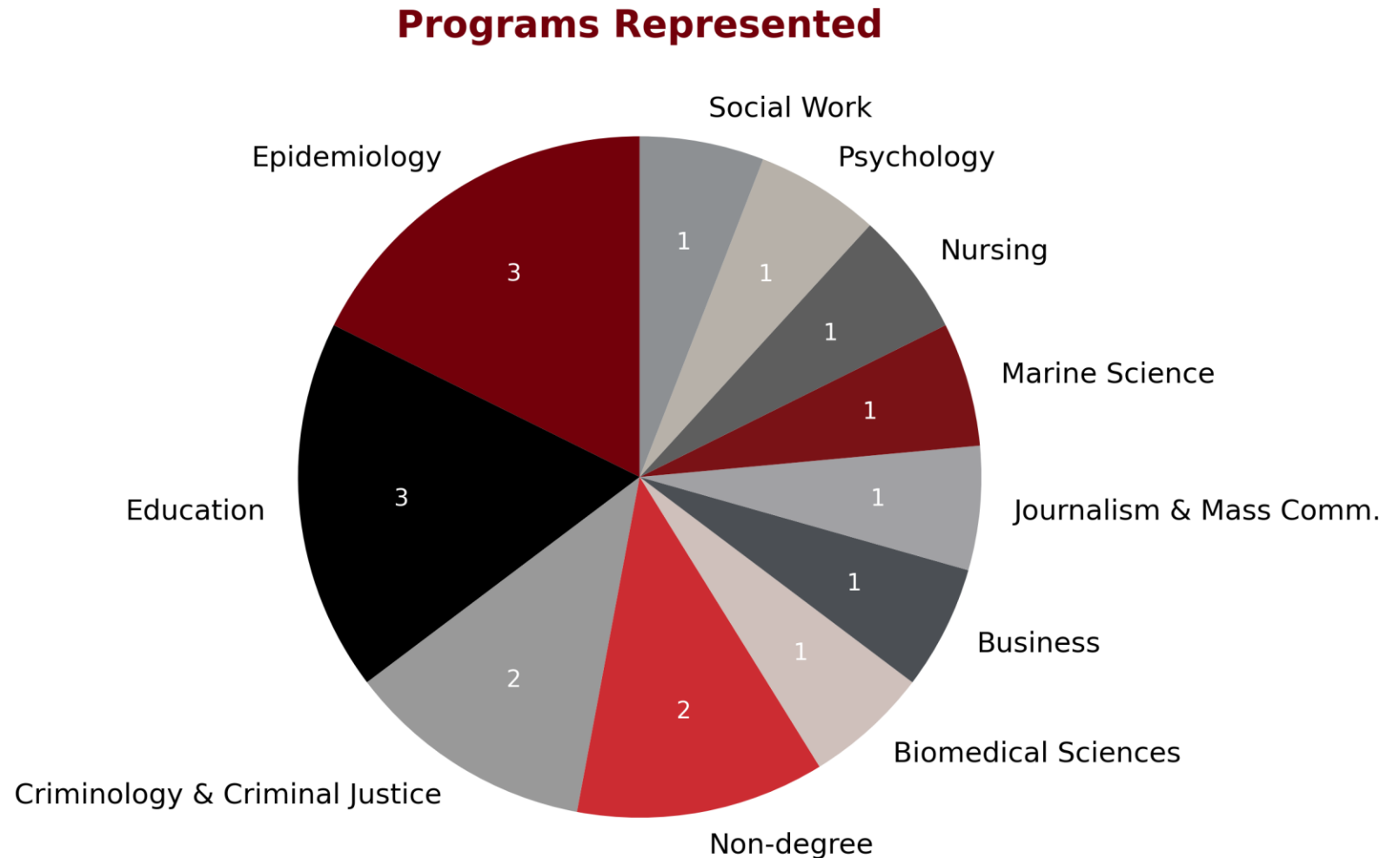


Student Demographics

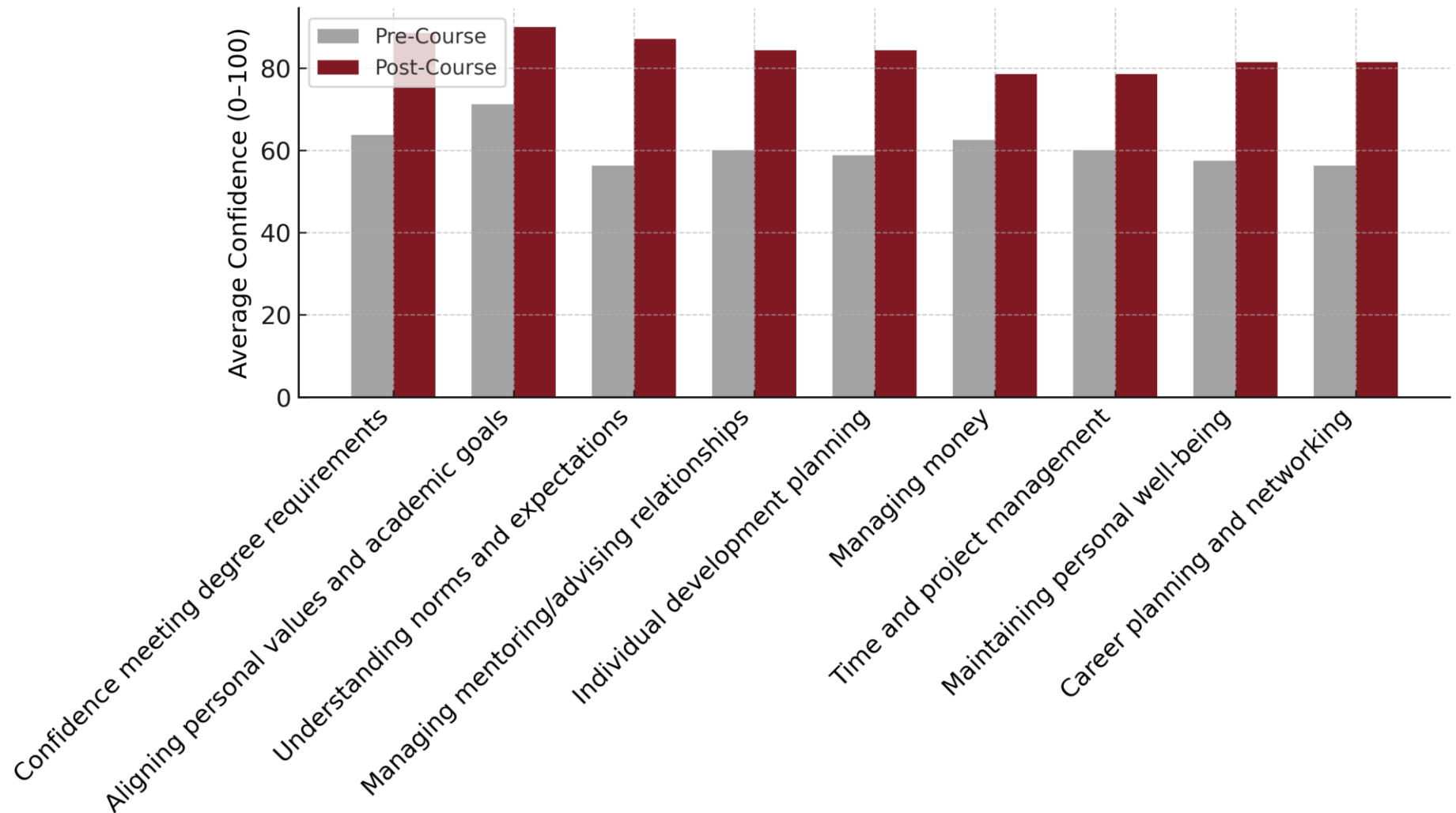

ASSESSMENT DATA: PRE VS. POST COURSE

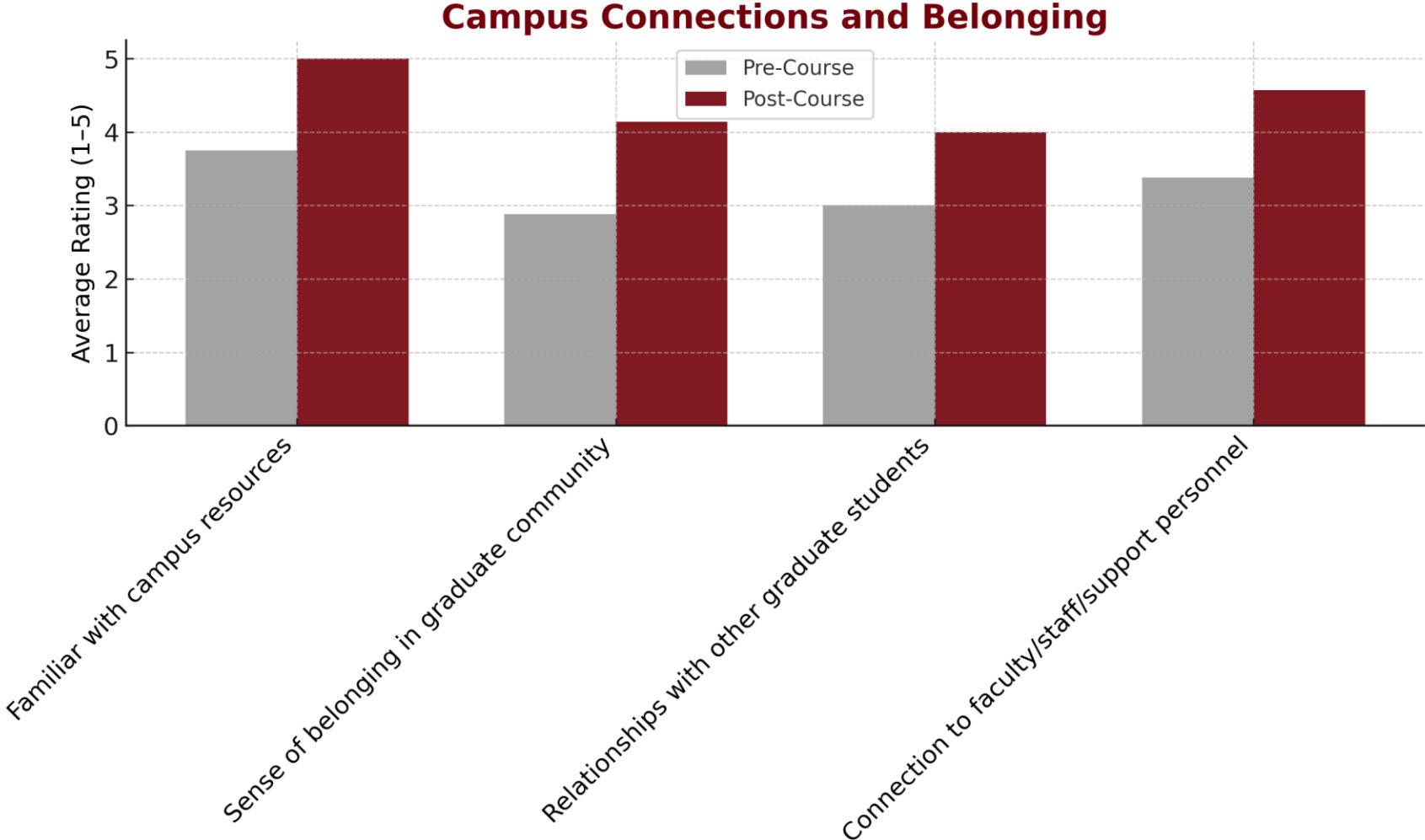
Academic and Professional Self-Confidence
